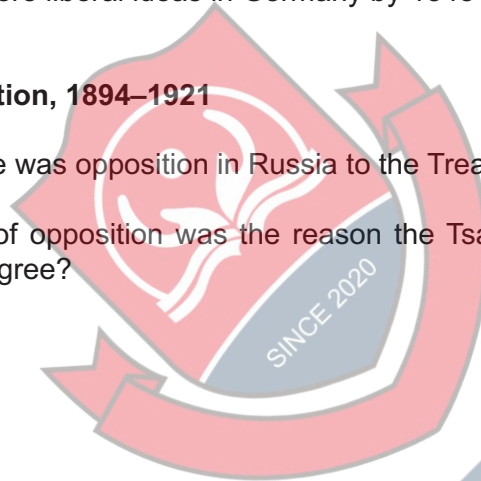
- (a) Explain why Napoleon agreed to the Concordat of 1801. [10]
