Global pattern of average annual rate of population change (%), 2015–2020

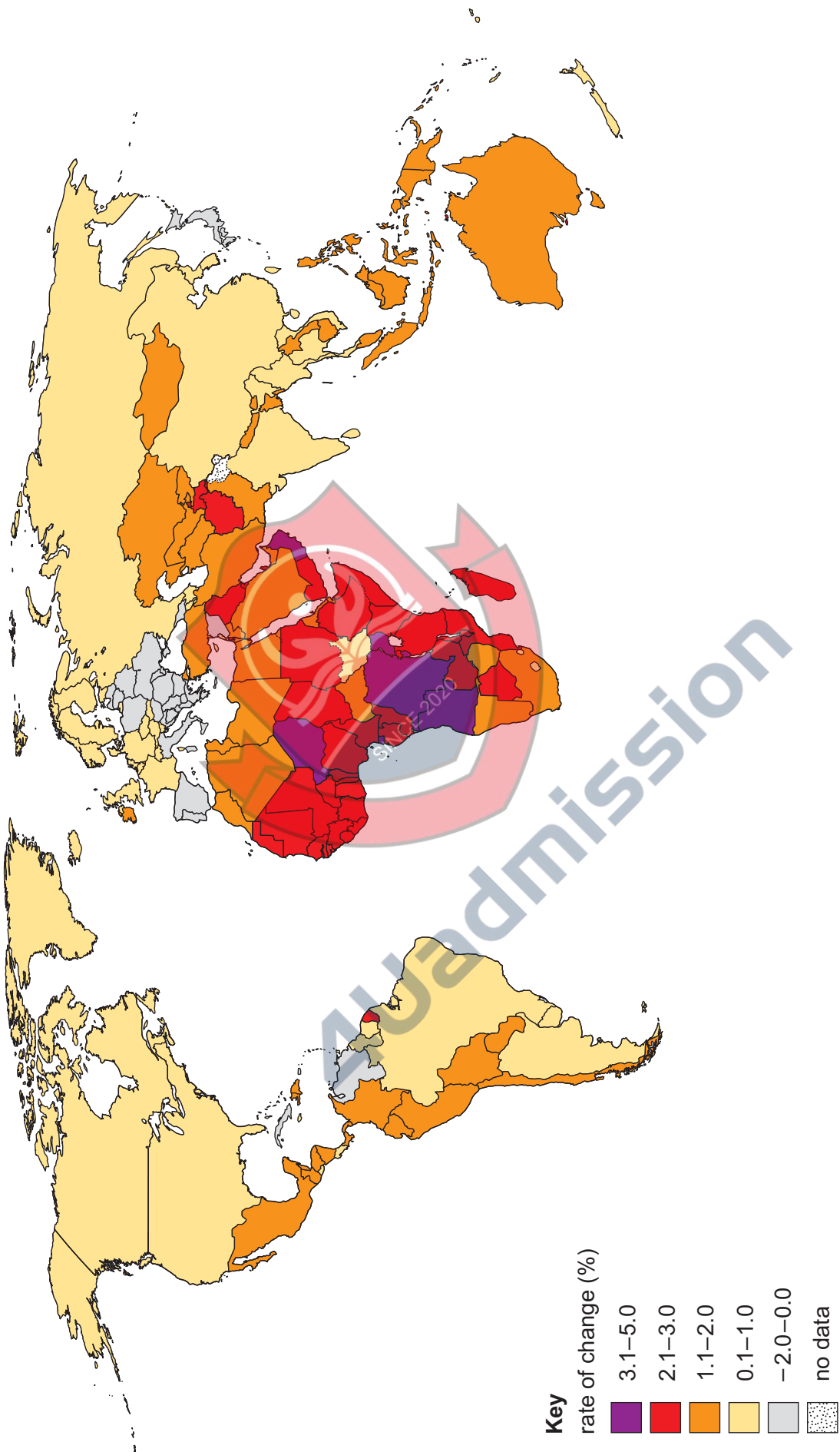


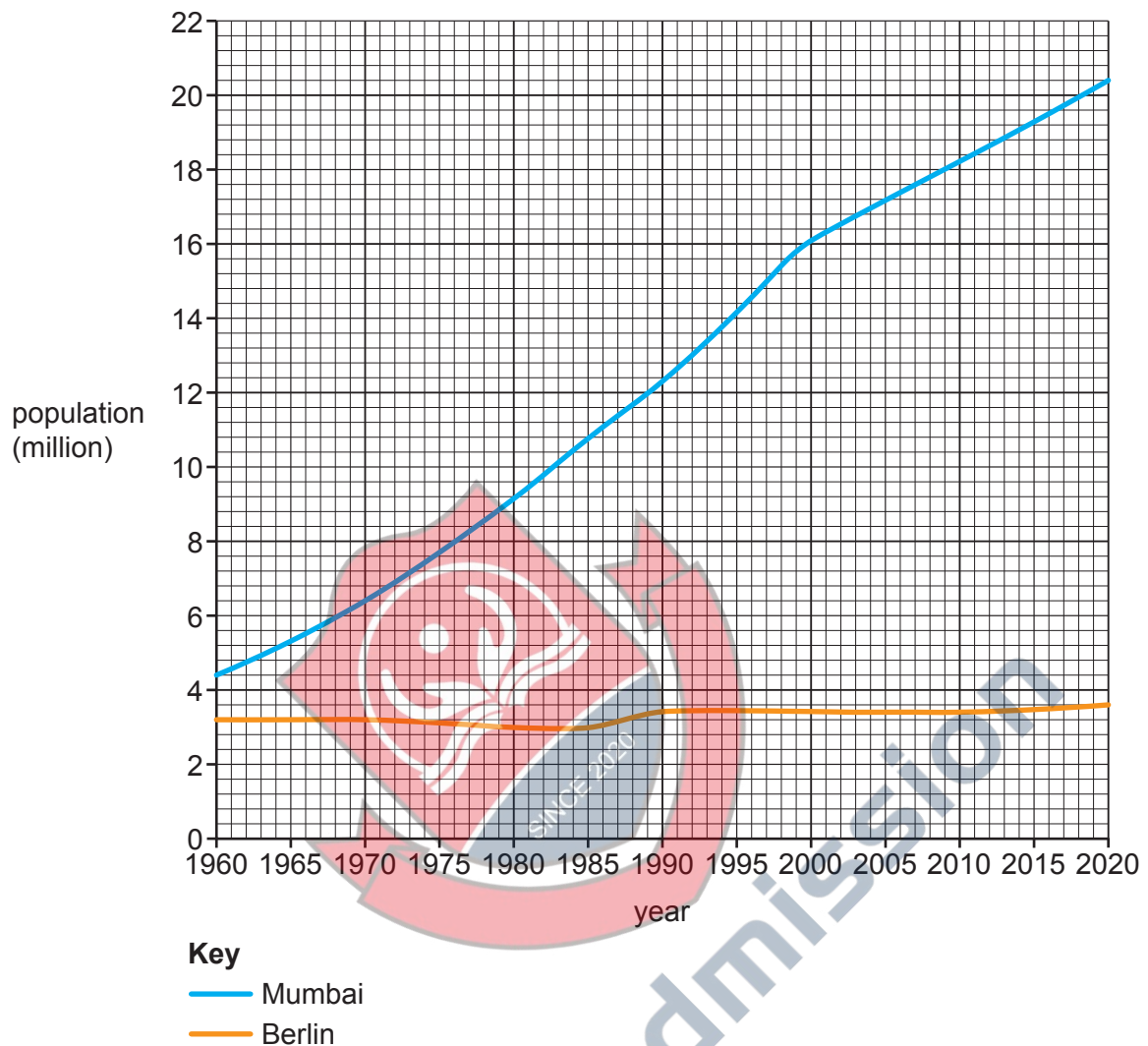
